## TTP2079 – Directions issued on 01 December 22

- 1. I am grateful to GWR for providing its Sole Reference Document.
- 2. At this stage I have only carried out a preliminary review of the SRD, as I am in a different time zone, but I am having difficulty in understanding some aspects of GWR's SRD. In particular, it says in 6.4 that no Remedy is sought from the TTP. If that is GWR's position, then I question why a TTP should be held at all? But in fact I think that the third paragraph within 6.3 represents the Remedy sought by GWR, that 'a route regarding rectification of the 2023 EAS be considered and implemented'.
- 3. However, these words are not as specific as earlier indications of what I understood to be GWR's case, that GWR is seeking an overall reduction of 25% in the level of proposed possessions in the 2023 EAS.
- 4. In this context I remind the Parties of my comments in the Directions issued on 13 October 22. While GWR has provided a summary of the effect of the proposals in the 2023 EAS, I have not found anything in the SRD which compares the proposed possessions in the 2023 EAS with previous years. While a comparison with previous years is not necessarily a determining factor in my decision, it would be extremely helpful to enable the Panel to understand the strength of this aspect of GWR's case.
- 5. This Appeal raises issues which I do not think have previously been considered by a TTP, so the Panel must be as fully informed as possible before the hearing date.

## Therefore I direct:

- A. That GWR should confirm what remedy it is seeking from the TTP.
- B. That GWR should set out a comparison between the quantum of proposed possessions in the 2023 EAS and in previous years. I recognise that this will not be an easy task, but the more information that can be provided the more helpful this will be to the Panel. I wish to ensure as far as possible that any effects on workloads resulting from the pandemic should be identified to avoid false comparisons being drawn.
- C. That GWR should supply to the Panel, with Network Rail copied in, Appendix F to its SRD, which is referred to but was not included in yesterday's submission.
- D. GWR should provide this information as soon as possible, in tranches if necessary. In any event the information must be filed and served by **1000 on Monday 05 December 22**.
- E. In its SRD, NR will obviously comment on GWR's figures, but it should also provide comparisons in the quantum of possessions in other Regions to compare with GWR's experience.
